A GLIMPSE OF MORAN MAHILA MAHAVIDYALAYA

INTRODUCTION

Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya was established on 8th July, 1992 at Moranhat- at the border of two districts of Upper Assam- Dibrugarh and Charaideo. The founder principal of the college was Dr. Sukha Baruah. Surrounded by tea gardens and ethnic villages, Moran is centre of art, literature and culture and a growing up town. The college is less than half kilometer away from the National Highway no. 37 and is the only Higher Educational Institute for girls of the locality. At present, there are about 1200 students from H.S. Classes onwards. The college has Provincialised under Govt. of Assam, 2013. The present principal in-charge of the college is Ms. Joysree Phukon.

ACADEMIC ASPECT

The college through various teaching departments is providing higher education to girls. Currently, it has been offering Hon's in Assamese, English, Economics, Education, History, Political Science and Sociology. Home Science as Non-hon's subject at Degree level. Moreover the college has also undertaken programmes under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU).

VISION STATEMENT

The college was established aiming at developing and spreading of higher education among financially weak and socially backward girls of the locality. Since its inception, the institute has been imparting higher education to girls with great enthusiasm with the help of skilled and dedicated teachers and the results of

both H.S. and Degree classes have been excellent day by day. The students of the college were even subsequently able to hold top position in Master Degree under Dibrugarh University. The teachers of the college guide the students for their mental and physical upliftment too. For this, Quiz competition, debating competition, seminars, lectures, workshops are organised occasionally in the college. National level seminars are also organised by various Departments of the college for development of a congenial atmosphere in the college.

OUR FUTURE CREATIVE VISION

Our upcoming endeavors for making our institution more vibrant are mentioned below :-

- We are going to introduce the **Science Stream** from the Academic Year 2023.
- To cope up with the **National Education Policy** we are going to introduce some vocational skill based courses. The Deptt. of Home Science had already taken initiative for **Course on Applied Art and Craft**.
- **Objective of the course:** To enhance skills of students for entrepreneurship development.

Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya Library (the name) was established in the year 1992 along with the college and since then it has remained as an integral part of academic excellence of the college. The library is rich on various books, journals, periodicals etc. and has already crossed a landmark collection 16,200 print volumes. The library has a Reference Section. Two daily newspaper of regional and national level are available to elucidate current awareness amongst the students and teachers.

The library provides an open access system. The library has also a reading room with a sitting capacity of more than 100 users at a time.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The Admission of our college is processed through State Bank of India, Moran Bazar Branch. Meritorious student's are offered "Direct Admission". Admission is held purely on merit basis. Three consecutive days are scheduled for the entire admission process of BA 1st semester classes. No monetary transaction is done in the college. Selected candidates herself has to go to the above mentioned bank for the deposit of the admission fees.

ADMISSION FEES :

Admission fees will have to confirm at the time of Admission Notification.

HOSTEL FACILITY AND ADMISSION

There is RCC hostel building in the college campus with all the essential facilities required for the students. Hostel admission is offered purely on merit basis among those students who secures 1st division in the HSLC and HS final examination. Sixty percent of vacant seats are reserved for students of degree level and forty percent of vacant seats are reserved to HS level. After availing seat border is bound to follow every rules and regulation of the hostel implied by the college authority. Hostel rules and regulations are notified immediately after the hostel admission.

Seats : 115 nos. Admission Fees will have to confirm at time of Hostel Admission Notification.

Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University was established under the provision of the Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University Act, 2005 enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly and published in the Assam Gazette dtd. 29/9/05 by the Govt. of Assam. Its study centre was initiated here (Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya) in May, 2012 with 48 students in the first batch (Degree 1st sem.) Next year, the enrolment rose upto 51 thereby making us fortunate enough to reach the level of 4th Sem. Another achievement to note is that we have already started BPP (Bachelor Preparatory Programme) so that all the undermatic individuals and disadvantaged groups can grab the opportunity for higher education. In this case we got 73 students in the first batch, and now the admission for the present session is going on.
